## 2 Apparel Project

#### 3 Clarification on scope of applicability

- 4 The project proposal for Sector Standard Project for Textiles and Apparel (approved by the GSSB on
- 5 10 February 2022) proposes that the Sector Standard for textiles and apparel will apply to
- 6 organizations whose primary focus lies on textile production, apparel manufacturing, footwear
- 7 manufacturing, and apparel and footwear retail.
- 8 The term apparel is widely used, and its definition varies from being just the same as clothing, to
- 9 including headwear, facial coverings, accessories such as scarves, sunglasses, jewelry, shoes, and
- 10 other articles worn as clothing<sup>1</sup>.
- 11 The proposal text does not make specific mention of accessories or jewelry. However, in Table 1 of
- 12 the proposal in which the Proposed sector key for the Sector Standards Project for Textiles and
- 13 Apparel are listed for some of the main sector classification standards, there is specific mention to
- subcategories "accessories" and "luxury items" under ICB and "luxury goods" under GICS<sup>2</sup>.
- 15 Considering the above, this addendum clarifies that the Sector Standard for textiles and apparel will
- 16 also apply to organizations whose primary focus lies on:
- accessories and jewelry manufacturing, and
  - accessories and jewelry retail.

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- 19 The scope of applicability of the Sector Standard for textiles and apparel will also be discussed with
- 20 the Textiles and Apparel Working Group.
