## 9 Session 1: Welcome to meeting

10 The Global Sustainability Standards Board (GSSB) Chair, Carol Adams (henceforth the Chair),  
11 welcomed the GSSB. The GSSB approved the draft summary for the meeting held on 26 February  
12 2026. There were no new developments regarding the action register from the last meeting.

13 Bastian Buck, Chief Standards Officer, provided an update on the policy submissions.

14 The Chair presented an overview of the meeting agenda. A quorum was established.

## 15 Session 2: Update Implementation 16 Projects 2026 – Q1

17 Bastian Buck, Chief Standards Officer, noted that there were no significant developments in the past  
18 month requiring discussion. As previously communicated, the team was adjusting to a significant  
19 capacity change and required additional time to reconfigure the project schedule. He indicated that an  
20 updated overview, including the project schedule, would be provided at the April meeting. The update  
21 would focus on standards-setting projects.

22 It was noted that further updates, particularly in relation to feedback on the work program, including  
23 potential guidance and research projects outside of due process, would be incorporated at a later  
24 stage.

25 Regarding the GRI Sector Program, the proposals have been shared with the governance bodies.  
26 Feedback was still pending, and finalization would follow discussions with the Management Board,  
27 with updates to be made as needed based on their input.

## 28 **Session 3: Topic Standard Project for** 29 **Pollution – Approval of PCP exposure** 30 **drafts**

31 Tamar Zijlstra, Senior Manager Standards, summarized GSSB comments received on Filestage  
32 (prior to 12 March) for the Air Pollution, Soil Pollution, and Critical Incidents exposure drafts, along  
33 with responses from the Standards Team. An explanation was provided on how GSSB feedback  
34 raised can be addressed later in the process and will be considered by the Pollution Working Group in  
35 combination with the PCP comments received. The comments will not lead to fundamental change to  
36 the drafts presented or any risk of re-exposure.

37 The key points discussed reflected further comments to those already submitted on Filestage:

- 38 • Air Pollution: linking carbon and global warming effects for clarity.
- 39 • Soil Pollution: consideration of additional comments for research while managing the risk of  
40 potential re-exposure; prioritize feedback to focus on substantive issues.
- 41 • Critical Incidents:
  - 42 ○ Ensuring near misses are adequately reflected in the guidance.
  - 43 ○ Ensuring there is no potential overlap across exposure drafts.
  - 44 ○ A sentence was included to clarify how critical incidents are embedded within  
45 enterprise risk management.
  - 46 ○ Additional comments will be considered for workplace-specific examples on  
47 preventable measures and determining incidents as critical (guidance only, not  
48 disclosures).

49 Bastian Buck, Chief Standards Officer, noted the importance of prioritizing feedback in the  
50 questionnaire to avoid overcomplication and confirmed that most comments could be addressed  
51 without changing the drafts. The Standards Team will identify high-priority comments (those GSSB  
52 felt strongly about or where multiple comments were received) and review the questionnaire to ensure  
53 feedback is captured.

64 on behalf of current and past GSSB members. Jeff Robertson, GSSB Vice Chair, presented a formal  
65 resolution of appreciation to the outgoing Chair on behalf of the GSSB.

66 The Chair expressed gratitude to the Standards Team, GSSB members, GRI staff, and other  
67 stakeholders for their support and collaboration during her tenure.
