- The SD clarified the following points about the project in response to GSSB questions and comments: 22
- The project categorized WG candidates according to GRI-predefined stakeholder categories. 23
  - The submission of the candidate for the investment institution category was based on a recommendation from the GRI Supervisory Board.
  - Some organizations are not located in the Global South, but candidates from these organizations are either based in or originate from the Global South.
    - The SD said it will reevaluate descriptions of WG members categorized as civil society organizations.



- GRI reaffirmed their commitment to appointing labor representatives to WGs or technical committees based on nominations from the Council of Global Unions.
  - If a need emerges, more WG members may be proposed during the project.
  - Subgroup progress will be discussed at WG meetings, where any outstanding issues can be addressed.
    - The role of the GSSB sponsor was clarified as someone with relevant expertise acting as a consistent link between the GSSB and the team developing a respective Standard.

- 40 Thamar Zijlstra, Senior Manager Standards, presented the draft project proposal for the GRI Topic
- 41 Standard Project for Pollution.
- 42 The GSSB had several questions about how the Standard will categorize different pollutants, and the
- 43 SD explained that this will become clearer following the scoping survey.
- The GSSB also asked about the relevance of including critical incident management in a future Topic
- 45 Standard for Pollution. The SD explained that the project will examine pollution related issues from
- 46 critical incidents, such as a significant spill, following a recommendation from the GRI Sector
- 47 Standard for Oil and Gas. The GRI Topic Standard Project for Pollution will explore this further during
- the scoping phase and then determine how best to integrate it into the Standard.
