### Position summary and job purpose

Are you experienced in managing translation projects in several languages, running multiple streams at the same time, and are you passionate about sustainability?

We are seeking an experienced Translation Manager to join our Standards Editorial & Publishing team in developing the GRI (Sustainability Reporting) Standards, the world's most widely used standards for sustainability reporting. The GRI Standards help organizations understand and disclose their economic, environmental and social impacts and meet the needs of information users for consistent and comparable information.

The Translation Manager facilitates making the GRI Sustainability Reporting Standards accessible for a diverse global audience. The GRI Standards currently contain 40 modular units that are available in 12 key languages. New standards are being added to the series and existing ones are revised. The translations are carried out by a professional translation agency, and they are reviewed by independent peer review panels of local sustainability professionals.

The Translation Manager will be responsible for leading all processes related to the translation of the GRI Standards and other technical publications. They will control expenditures, plan and coordinate production schedules and liaise with external suppliers and advisors. The Translation Manager will make sure that the translation projects are delivered to the highest standards and on schedule.

The Translation Manager will report to the Senior Publications Manager, Standards.

# Job responsibilities

Manages all aspects of translating he GRI Standards and other technical publications into 11 languages, including:

- Developing, managing and continuously improving internal processes for translations of the GRI Standards and other technical publications
- Managing ongoing translations projects and setting up new ones
- Administrative duties including planning and financial administration
- Managing contacts with and coordinating translation projects with external parties
- Participating in setting up external peer review panels for translations and coordinating their reviews
- Managing uploading and formatting content in the content management system (Umbraco)
- Responding to external and internal queries about new and existing translation projects
