Background

The GRI Sector Program focuses on the development of standards that are specific to certain sectors. GRI Sector Standards describe the sustainability context for a sector, outline topics that are likely material for an organization in the sector based on the sector's significant impacts, and list disclosures that are relevant for the sector to report. They are an addition to the family of GRI Standards, completing and strengthening the current framework.

GRI Sector Standards are issued by the Global Sustainability Standards Board (GSSB), GRI's independent standard-setting body. The GSSB oversees the development of the GRI Standards according to a formally defined <u>Due Process Protocol</u>. The GSSB has identified the mining sector¹ as a priority sector for developing a Sector Standard.

The purpose of the Mining Working Group (WG) is to contribute expertise to the development of a Sector Standard for the mining and quarrying sectors, for the consideration of the GSSB.
