# 4 Introduction

# **5** The Global Sustainability Standards Board

- 6 The Global Sustainability Standards Board (GSSB) is responsible for issuing the GRI Sustainability
- 7 Reporting Standards (GRI Standards). The GSSB is an independent operating entity established
- 8 under the auspices of GRI. It comprises 15 members representing diverse stakeholder perspectives
- 9 and a range of expertise on sustainability reporting. The GSSB operates under its <u>Terms of</u>
- 10 <u>Reference</u> and follows a formally defined due process to ensure that the GRI Standards are
- 11 developed in the public interest through an independent, transparent, and multi-stakeholder process.
- 12 The <u>Due Process Oversight Committee</u> oversees the application of the <u>GSSB Due Process Protocol</u>.

# **Overview of GSSB activities 2020-2022**

- 14 Between the first quarter of 2020 to the final quarter of 2022, the GSSB developed the GRI Standards
- 15 according to the priorities identified in the <u>GSSB Work Program 2020-2022</u>. During this period, the
- 16 GSSB convened 35 virtual meetings and only one in-person meeting spanning two days in October
- 17 2022 due to Covid-19 related travel restrictions during this period.
- 18 The GSSB approved *GRI 306: Waste 2020* and steered the development and final approval of the
- revised GRI Universal Standards 2021, comprising GRI 1: Foundation 2021, GRI 2: General
- 20 Disclosures 2021, and GRI 3: Material Topics 2021.
- 21 In the Sector Program, the GSSB approved the list of sectors prioritized in the work program. This
- 22 period also saw the completion of the Sector Program pilot projects, culminating in the publication of
- 23 GRI 11: Oil and Gas Sector 2021, GRI 12: Coal Sector 2022, and GRI 13: Agriculture, Aquaculture
- 24 and Fishing Sectors 2022.
- 25 In addition, the GSSB approved projects for the mining sector and revision projects for biodiversity
- 26 and labor. The GSSB also approved project proposals for the food and beverages sector, the textiles
- 27 and apparel sector, and the draft project proposals for climate and financial services.

# **28 Timeline of meetings and activities**

### 29 2020

- 30 In 2020, the GSSB continued with the work to revise the Universal Standards and discussed feedback
- 31 on specific concepts and disclosures, with the eventual approvals of exposure drafts *GRI 101, 102*,
- 32 and 103. After nearly 150 submissions were received on the Universal Standards exposure drafts, the
- 33 GSSB discussed the substantive comments made by the public on key concepts, the statement of
- 34 use, governance disclosures, and the reporting model.



- 35 The final version of GRI 306: Waste 2020 was approved, with an effective date of 1 January 2022.
- 36 For the Sector Program, the GSSB supported the decision to develop coal as a separate Standard
- 37 and approved the exposure draft of the GRI Sector Standard for Oil and Gas.
- 38 After considering the final list of prioritized sectors, the GSSB revised and approved the GSSB Work
- 39 Program 2020-2022.

- 105 2021, GRI 2: General Disclosures 2021, and GRI 3: Material Topics 2021), with an effective date of 1 106 January 2023.
