Position summary and job purpose

This is an exciting opportunity to be part of sustainability programs that have transformative impact around the world! Within the Strategic Partners and Programs (SPP) team, GRI is looking to recruit an **Analyst Program Implementation**. The SPP team is responsible for developing partnerships and raising funds from institutional donors such as governments and charitable foundations, and for the implementation and management of all donor funded programs at GRI.

We are looking for a self-starter who can pro-actively contribute to the day-to-day management of the donor funded programs. This includes budget control, data collection, assisting the drafting of reports as well as the responsibility for maintaining GRI's Digital Reporting Platform. You work closely with your team members at GRI's secretariat in Amsterdam and overseas to ensure an effective implementation of the programs. The successful candidate reports to Head of Sustainability Programs Management who leads the Program Implementation & Management (PIM) sub team within the wider SPP team, and which is responsible for delivering and managing all donor funded programs across the organisation.

Job responsibilities

- In coordination with line manager, coordinates budget preparation and control for all donor funded programs
- Support the development and maintenance of an organisational content sharing platform topic-specific presentations, internal case evidence collected, external resources to evidence sustainability reporting impact.
- Assist the drafting of reports, gathering input from relevant stakeholders, inclusion of progress data
- Maintain and contributing to improvements in GRI's Digital Reporting Platform
- Respond to requests from the colleagues based overseas and in Amsterdam for (updated) data visualisation materials (e.g. slide-decks, charts, narrative)
- Oversees the development of and adherence to contracts and agreements with external parties under donor funded programs
- Design and coordinate data collection (incl. validation, recording, analysis, and reporting for project indicators
- Undertake administrative activities related to donor-funded programs
- Support to organization of events in the SPP team
- Ad hoc support to fundraising activities
- Other duties as requested
